

Anti-Scn2b(Sodium channel beta-2 subunit) Polyclonal Antibody

Description:

Scn2b(Sodium channel beta-2 subunit) is crucial in the assembly, expression, and functional modulation of the heterotrimeric complex of the sodium channel. The beta-2 subunit causes an increase in the plasma membrane surface area and in its folding into microvilli. Scn2b interacts with TNFR may play a crucial role in clustering and regulation of activity of sodium channels at nodes of Ranvier. The sodium channel consists of a pore-forming alpha subunit, beta-1 and beta-2 subunits. Beta-1 is noncovalently associated with alpha, while beta-2 is covalently linked by disulfide bonds.

Immunogen/Specificity:

Polyclonal antibody produced in rabbits immunizing with a synthetic peptide corresponding to N-terminal residues of rat Scn2b (Sodium channel beta-2 subunit precursor)
